

## DIRECTIONS TO START POINTS

The Georgetown YRE will start at the Georgetown Visitors Center -- 103 W. 7<sup>th</sup> St., Georgetown, TX 78626. From Austin: N on I-35, Exit 261/University Ave. Turn right on University, turn left on Austin, right on 7th St. From Waco: S on I-35, Exit 262/Williams Dr, turn left on Williams to Austin Ave, right on Austin, then left on 7th St.

The Canyon of the Eagles Resort walk will start at the Park Store of the resort – 16942 RR 2341, Burnet, TX 78611.

- From the South: Take IH 35 North to Georgetown. Take exit 261 (Burnet -Taylor exit) – turn left (*west*) at light onto State Hwy 29. Continue West on State Hwy 29 through Burnet. Three miles west of Burnet, turn right onto RR 2341. Follow RR 2341 15 miles – which dead ends at the Canyon of the Eagles Nature Park gate and the Resort is inside the park.
- OR: Take US Hwy 281 North to Burnet. Turn left at the intersection onto State Hwy 29 (There is a traffic light at this intersection). Follow the above directions.
- From the North: Take IH 35 South to Georgetown. Take exit 261 (Burnet -Taylor exit) – turn right (*west*) at light to get on Hwy 29 West. Follow directions “From the South.”
- OR: Get onto US Hwy 281 South and follow to Burnet (*do not turn off of 281 between Lampasas and Burnet*). Follow the above directions.
- From the West: Take your route of choice to Llano (16, 29, or 71). Head east on 29. Turn left onto FM/RR 690. Turn left onto FM 2341. Follow the above directions.

The Round Rock YRE will start at the BACA Senior Center – 301 W. Bagdad Ave., Round Rock Tx 78664. From N and S: IH 35, exit 252B, RM 620. N: turn right to Round Rock (620). S turn left, cross highway, to Round Rock (620). Go 2 blocks, turn right to N Brown, right to Bagdad. BACA Center is 2nd building on left, free parking nearby. The Walk Box is located in the reception area, bottom shelf of the center information kiosk.

**ELIGIBILITY/TYPE OF EVENT:** Noncompetitive. Walk or run at your own pace. The events are open to all, and families are encouraged to participate. Children under 12 must be accompanied by an adult. All participants (or their parents if under 12) will sign a waiver of responsibility and must carry a Start Card on the route. The Georgetown and Round Rock walks will be conducted as Featured Year Round Events. The Canyon of the Eagles walk will be a Traditional Event. The events will be held regardless of weather conditions.

November 12 – Georgetown YRE. **START POINT:** Georgetown Visitors Center, 103 W. 7th St., Georgetown Tx 78626. **REGISTRATION:** Open on Fridays 9-5. Walkers will find a person to assist in registration from 11-1. **DISTANCE:** 6 & 10 km. **WALK ROUTE:** 1A, sidewalks and walking trails.

November 13 – Canyon of the Eagles Traditional. **START POINT:** Park Store, Canyon of the Eagles Resort, 16942 RR 2341, Burnet, TX 78611. **REGISTRATION:** Saturday, 9-11. When you enter the park, tell the gate attendant that you are with the Texas Walking Clubs. They can direct you to the Park Store (end of the road). Walkers should be finished by 1:30. **DISTANCE:** 6 & 11 km. **WALK ROUTE:** 2B, rural trails (gravel, dirt), so consider appropriate footwear and hat. Restrooms are available at the start and along the route.

November 14 – Round Rock YRE. **START POINT:** BACA Senior Center, 301 W. Bagdad Ave. Round Rock Tx, 78664. **REGISTRATION:** Open on Sundays 8-1. Walkers will find a person to assist in registration from 10-12. **DISTANCE:** 5 & 10 km. **WALK ROUTE:** 1A, sidewalks and walking trails.

**PETS:** Leashed pets are allowed along the routes; however, not in buildings along the routes. You must clean up after your pets.

**Unsolicited Hint:** There are several YREs on the way to and from these events. If you haven't been in the area for a while, think about extending your visit and trying those at Enchanted Rock, Comfort, Stonewall, Boerne (3), Bandera (2), Mason, Kerrville (4), and Junction (2). Remember, Some State Parks require reservations, so plan accordingly.
